

Google Gemini (previously Bard) - AI creative collaborator, similar to ChatGPT. How to access - Gain full access by logging into your Google account. https://gemini.google.com \*Tip - You should try the same prompt in both ChatGPT and Gemini and compare the results.

How to access - Access through Discord, but this Start Here guide will walk you through everything.
